As you are all aware, we were forced to cancel the 2020 Tourvest African Icons Invitational scheduled for Dullstroom in Mpumalanga this month, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. 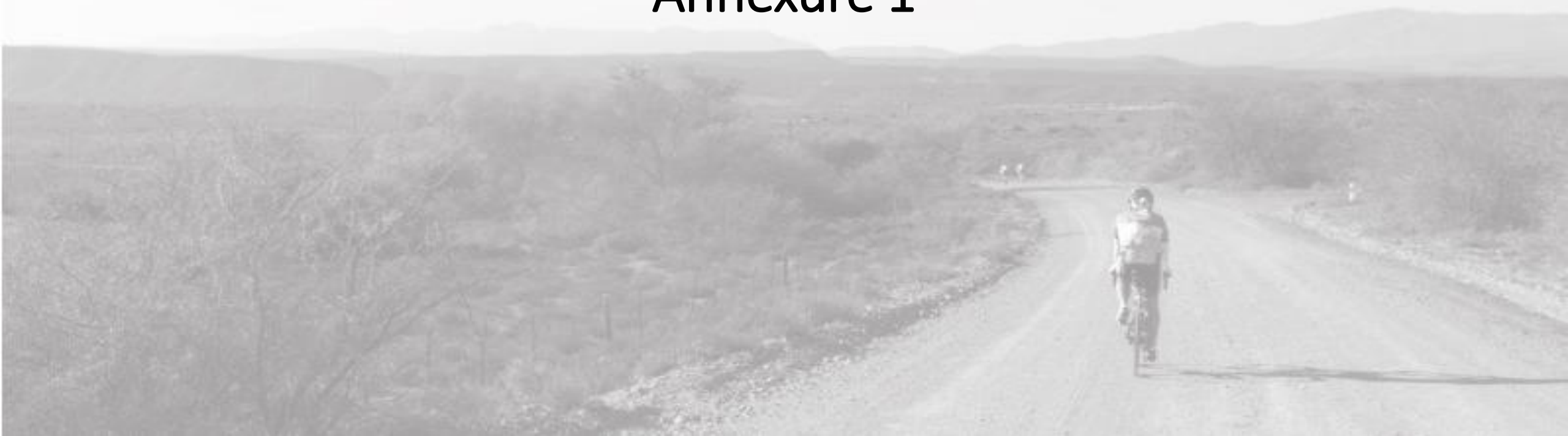

The WIDOWS and ORPHANS FUND

The Widows and Orphans Fund for South African Police Service (SAPS) officers killed in the line of duty was founded on 23 July 1920 and became a Company on 8 December 1993. The Fund is a private organisation that is managed as a non-profit company. The purpose of the fund is to provide financial assistance to the dependents of deceased contributors to the Fund. Serving and retired SAPS members must be contributors at the time of death in order for their dependents to apply for financial assistance.

Benefits offered to contributors and their dependents include,

- Financial aid to children up to the age of 19 years/Grade 12;
- Financial aid to disabled dependents for as long as necessary;
- Widow/widowers who are in financial need may apply for a term grant;
- A once-off payment to the widow/widower of a serving contributor directly after his/her death;
- A free mid-week holiday at Weesgerus Holiday Resort for the lawful widow/widower of a deceased contributor

SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE EDUCATION TRUST (SAPSET)

SAPSET embraces the social responsibility of taking care of the fallen heroes' and heroines' children's educational needs by providing financial and resource support to a child or children of an employee who has been appointed in terms of the South African Police Service.

SAPSET was registered on 23 November 2010 in order for the children of the fallen members who sacrifices their lives could be given a brighter future. They are funded by gifts, donations and sponsorships from private persons, firms, companies as well as Employee and Employer contributions

SAPSAET provides,

- Financial assistance to the children of SAPS employees (SAPS Act and PSA) that die in the execution of official duties and on duty by financing the costs of their educational needs – from Grade R to Tertiary level;*
- Pays a discretionary amount of school / tuition fees only into the beneficiaries' learning institution's bank account. No money is paid to individual's bank account;*
